To be made by the Widow who has never had a Land Warrant.

STATE OF *Alabama*COUNTY OF *Randolph*On this *Eighteenth* day of *September* A. D., 1855, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the peace, within and for the County and State, aforesaid:

Gracie Hoyitt aged *43* years, a resident of the County of *Randolph* Co., in the State of *Alabama*, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of *Alisa Hoyitt* deceased, who was a *private* in the Company commanded by Captain *Andrew Stating* in the Regiment of *Volunteers* commanded by Col. *Scott*, in the War with *Great Britain*, *Declared by the United States*, that she was married to the said *Alisa Hoyitt* in *North Carolina* on the *15th* day of *April* in the year *1810*, that her maiden name was *Woodard* that her said husband died in the year *1831* and that she is now a widow.

that she has no record of no public nor private record by which she can prove her marriage & the death of her husband.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which she may be entitled under Act of March 3d, 1855, never having received nor applied for bounty land under this or any other Act of Congress.

She hereby appoints *James H. White* of *Winston Randolph Co. Ala.* her attorney, to prosecute and receive her warrant.

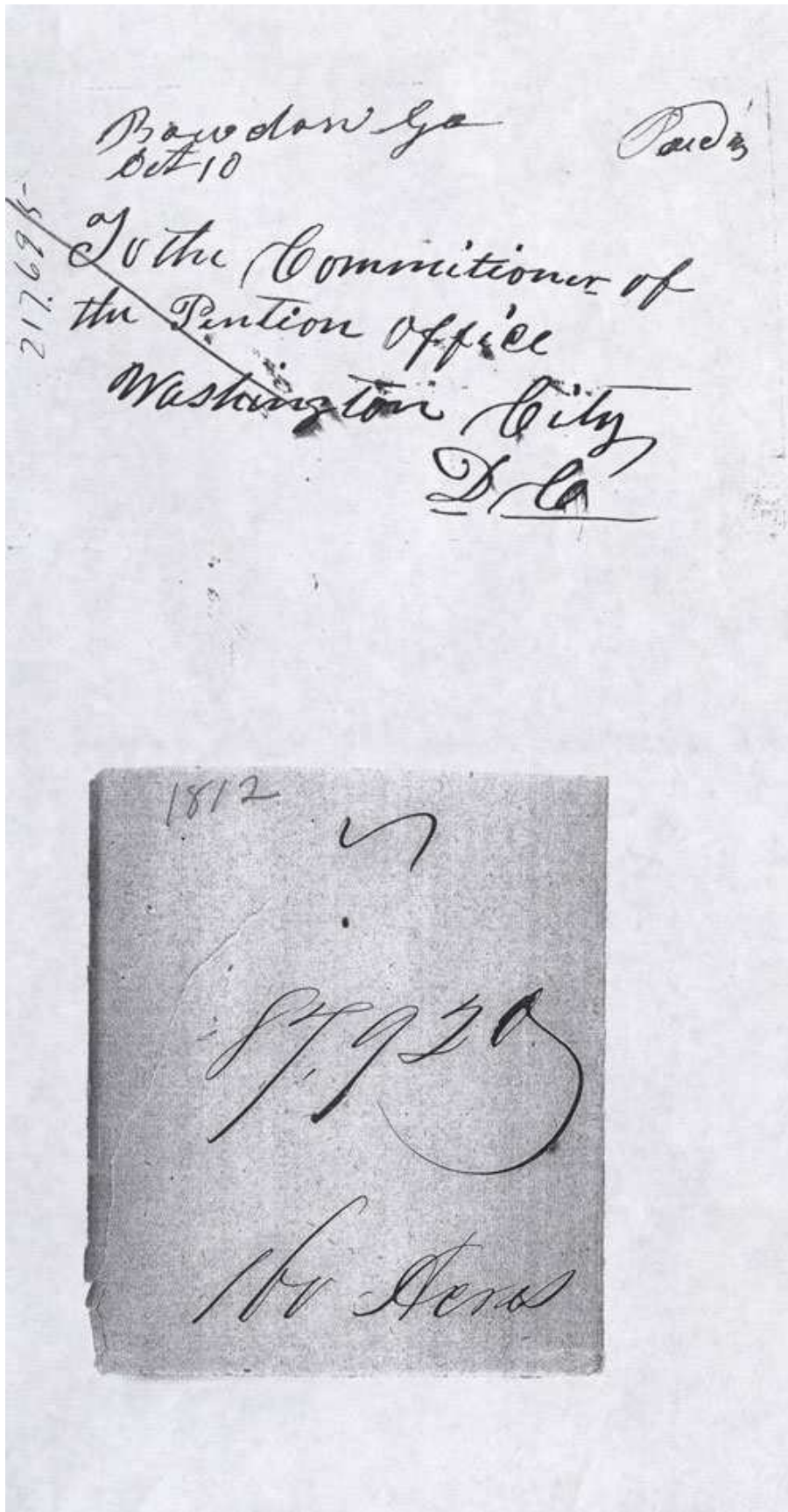

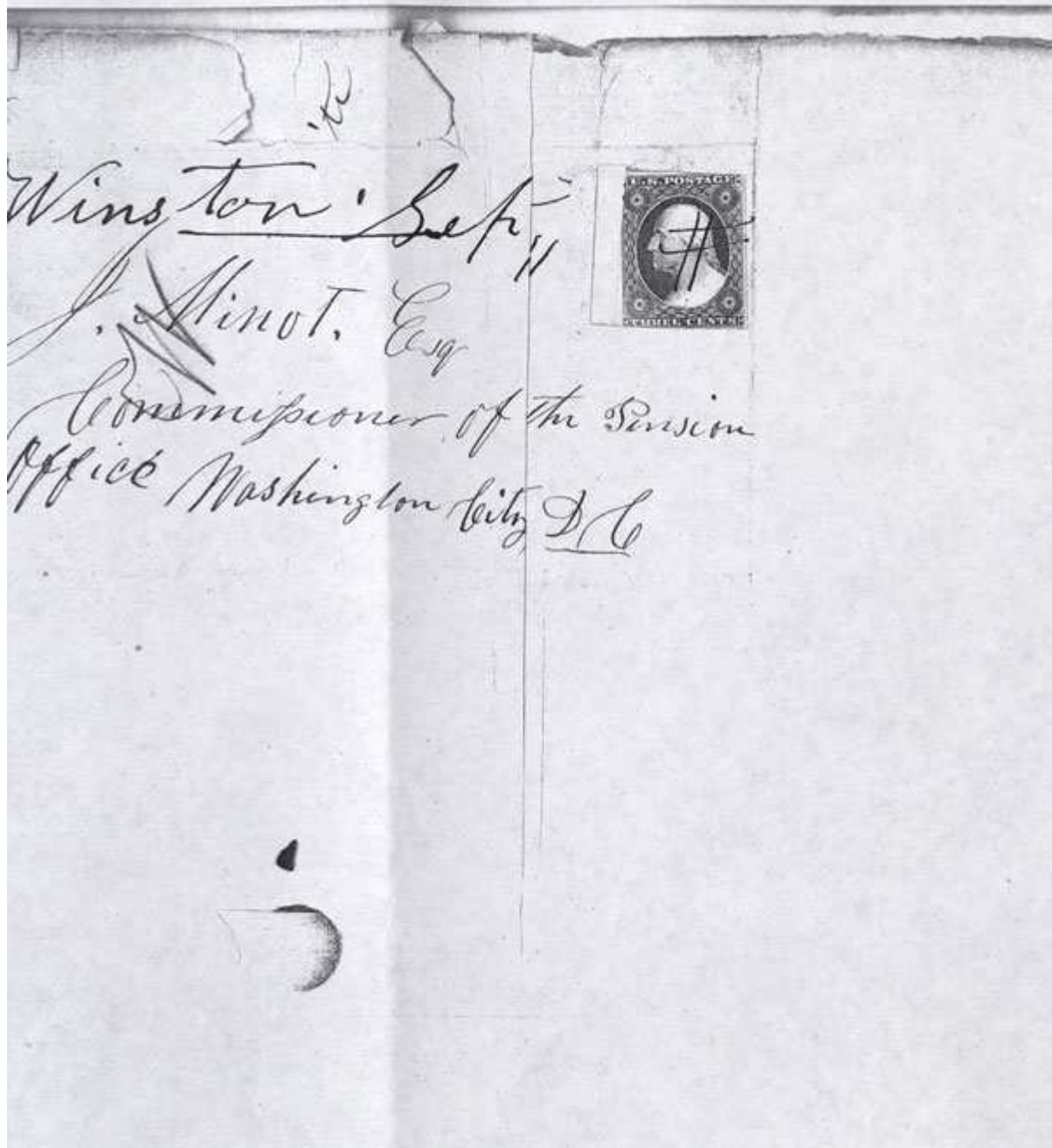

On this the third day of June one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine (1859), personally appeared before me Ruben Jackson a justice of the peace, within and for the County and State aforesaid Irene Hyatt aged sixty five years a resident of the County and State above named who being duly sworn according to law declares that she is the widow of the colonel - cal Allsa Hyatt, who was a private soldier in the company commanded by Captain Blue in the Regiment of North Carolina militia, commanded by Col or Genl Scott.

That her said husband ^{and entered the service} volunteered in the County of Anson in the state of North Carolina on or about the 4th day of July 1813 - for the term of six months in the war of 1812 and continued in the actual service in said war for the term of two months and more and was honorably discharged at the expiration of his said term as will more fully appear by the muster and pay rolls of said Captain Blue's Company.

She further states that she was married to the said Allsa Hyatt on the 17th day of April AD 1811. in the County of Anson in the state of North Carolina by one Elias Poulby a justice of the peace.

That her name before her said marriage was Irene Woodard. She further declares that she has ~~not~~ private nor public record of her said marriage.

marriage that if there be any she does not know it neither is there any eye witnesses now living That her said husband Eliza Hyatt died on the 31st day of October 1831 in Anson County in the state of North Carolina and that she is still a widow that is she is unmarried -

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which she may be entitled under the act of 3rd March 1855 she further declares that she has never received a warrant for bounty land under this nor any other act of Congress for said ^{nor made any other application} service except the declaration filed by James P. White no 217695 to which this ^{is} a supplement and additional evidence which was suspended 26 Sept 1856 ~~for~~

James Bell of Eastville Alabama is hereby authorized to prosecute my claim and receive the warrant that may issue thereon
